What follows is a chart with dates that this author considers important. They give a skeletal framework to guide the student in the study of the Scriptures. Of course, the dates are not absolute, but precise enough that they will serve as a framework.

"Nissan 1 in the $20^{\text {th }}$ year of Artaxerxes Longimanus was March 14, 445 B.C.

Nissan 10 whereupon Christ entered Jerusalem on the donkey was Sunday April 6, AD 32

The intervening period was 476 years (plus the 24 days from 14 March to $6^{\text {th }}$ April), thus

"As this total represents the entire number of days from the issuing forth of the decree in the $20^{\text {th }}$ year of Artaxerxes (assumes Neh. 2:1 is 1 Nissan) unto the crucifixion, all that now need be done was to divide 173,880 by 360 and obtain precisely 483 "prophetic" years with no remainder. Daniel 9:25-27 was apparently fulfilled to the very day." ${ }^{1}$
