- 3. The daily morning sacrifice was made at the 3<sup>rd</sup> hour (9:00 am) Jesus was crucified the 3<sup>rd</sup> hour.
- 4. The daily evening sacrifice was made at the 9<sup>th</sup> hour (3:00 pm) Jesus gave up the Ghost at the 9<sup>th</sup> hour.
- 5. According to Scripture, evening is 12 hours, morning is 12 hours

Note the "2<sup>nd</sup> evening" "times" are often called watches, which correspond to the first and second watches [e.g., 1<sup>st</sup> watch (between 6 pm and 9 pm), 2<sup>nd</sup> watch (between 9 pm and 12 MN), 3<sup>rd</sup> watch (between 12MN and 3 am), and 4<sup>th</sup> watch (between 3 am and 6 am)].
